- I. Identifying cultural differences that truly matter
 - A. Recognize culturally-based learning preferences and styles: relationship-, process-, and goal-oriented
 - B. Understand the student's own cultural traditions
- II. Redefining and restating the essential cultural ideals that we share
 - A. Explore similarities in cultural capital to establish positive rapport
 - B. Keep the student's world at the core of the teaching-learning process
- III. Teaching indispensable skills within the experience of culture
 - A. Body alignment, inhalation, and onset/release
 - B. Resonance/vowels
 - C. Articulation
 - D. Performance/emotive aspects
- IV. Applying cross-cultural vocal techniques to facilitate genuine self-expression
 - A. Invite the student to self-expression within familiar cultural standards
 - B. Choose repertoire to assist skills acquisition and positive cultural impact: specific selections, poets and poetic themes, composers, languages, styles, and aesthetics which allow both teacher and student a glimpse into the other's world
