Other topics will include: teaching space, advertising, studio policies, web visibility, and the psychology of sales as it relates to voice teachers. NATIONAL ONLINE SCREENING

April 12, 2019 - Deadline for online digital submissions. Top 14 singers from each category advance to the National Semifinal Round at St. Olaf College.

SEMIFINAL AND FINAL ROUNDS

June 27–28, 2019, as part of the NATS Summer Workshop at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota

Top three singers from each category advance to final round. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners receive prize money.

Later this month, the chapter will do a workshop with USU Faculty and yoga teacher Venicia Wilson on body awareness and singing with one's whole self.


