Led by Dr. Ann Rhodes of Berea College, a specialist in the Alexander Technique, a group of more than thirty students gathered to experience, learn, and apply the foundational Alexander techniques in an all day seminar hosted by AC-SNATS. The morning session was filled with warm-ups, exercises, and an introduction to the Alexander Technique. After a brief break for lunch,



the afternoon was full of opportunity to put these exercises to practice as **Dr**.

Rhodes worked with each student individually.



Majors and non-majors, vocalists, instrumentalists, and keyboardists explored together the theory of relaxation and breathing. The students experienced first hand that relaxing the body and maintaining a comfortable position while performing produced the best possible resonance



and sound from one's own instrument. Some student comments about the seminar:
