3 credits, 2 75-minute class meetings per week, 15 weeks

This course covers the fundamentals, techniques, and methods of teaching voice in one-on-one and group settings. Topics include anatomy, physiology, function of voice, and voice health. Course includes observations of teaching, and practical application of material in individual teaching experiences.
